A Note From The Treasurer

Hello Ku-Ni-Eh Lodge! Thank you all for paying your dues this year. The \$20 dollars you pay each year goes towards facilitating leadership, fellowship, and service opportunities for our Arrowmen and our community. If you have still not paid, there are two different options (\$20 standard and \$100 season pass) available on Ku-Ni-Eh's website at ku-ni-eh.org in the pay dues tab at the bottom of the drop down menu.

Your dues pay for things such as camperships to fund activities for Arrowmen, general camp repair services and projects on our four camps, and this year a new blob tower and the OA trail kiosks. The blob tower adds value to Frieldlander improving the safety and the new Wehinapay and arrow help identify our Lodge with the work we put into our camps. The new kiosks are at the trail heads of the OA trail to provide directions and camp information.

The prices of the supplies the Lodge needs to function have almost doubled, but due to our members' continued support, we have been able to keep the fees stable for the past four years while continuing to provide quality experiences to our members and service to our community.

The trading post is as active as ever with a great selection of items available online and four new fundraising patches! These patches include two bengal stripe patches in orange and white, the Live Scout Loud patch, and a Waffle House patch! These are available online and at the Scout Achievement Center. The entire trading post is open at every Ku-Ni-Eh event, and this summer, many items will be available at the Camp Friedlander trading post! This is a great opportunity for the Lodge to make the money it needs to continue to support our Arrowmen.

Here's some of our advice for this month:

What two items hold a tent together? That's right, stakes and poles. These items can mean all the difference during any night spent in the woods; you should know how to replace or repair them. It is best practice to always carry an extra stake. If you ever find yourself needing one and not having an extra, for yourself or for another camper, you can carve a stake out of any narrow piece of hardwood. If your stake is bent, find a big rock to bend it straight. You should use your boot to hold the straight end flat. If you are without a tent pole, you can try tying it off to a tree with paracord. That works very well with the rain fly too. Any break in a pole along a straight segment can be fixed by securing a stick along the break with duct tape. Metal tent pole splints are also handy and low-cost. A break in an angled

metal connector is harder, but a stick and duct tape holding the two sections together works like magic. Always carry duct tape, paracord, and a knife so you'll never be without a solution in the woods! -Alton Jester
